BC Transit has taken the Transit app to the next level and has introduced an enhanced version offering additional features for all RDN Transit and BC Transit Riders.

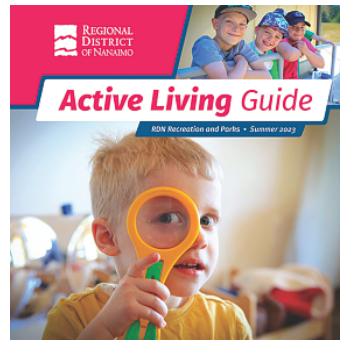

CURBSIDE ORGANICS CART TIPS

Wet materials can tend to stick to the cart, making it difficult to collect the cart contents. Here's how you can prevent material from sticking inside the cart:

- Use crumpled-up balls of flyer sheets or newspapers at the bottom of the green cart before putting any food or yard waste in.
- Layer wet material (kitchen scraps) with dry material (leaves, newspaper).
- Wrap high-moisture food contents in newspapers or flyers.
- Put the material into your cart closer to collection day.
