RDN and Qualicum Beach Sandpiper Water Supply Project Now Complete

The Regional District of Nanaimo (RDN) and the Town of Qualicum Beach are pleased to announce the completion of the Sandpiper subdivision water supply project. Residents who have been enjoying high-quality drinking water via a temporary link since November 2021 can now celebrate a permanent connection.

Through the water supply agreement signed in 2021, Qualicum Beach provides bulk water to the RDN's Sandpiper reservoir. The RDN allocated \$970,000 from the Electoral Area G Community Works Fund to cover the capital costs to bring water to the reservoir. The funds will also support future water supply improvements for the Chartwell and Eaglecrest neighbourhoods in Qualicum Beach as well as Sandpiper. The RDN will continue to operate and maintain its Sandpiper reservoir and pumphouse.

Although Sandpiper residents will see an increase in their water rates, the new water supply eliminates longstanding water quality concerns associated with groundwater supply wells that had been in use by the residents since 1980.

With the completion of the permanent water connection, landscape remediation at the Sandpiper reservoir site will begin in the coming weeks.
