Free Workshops on How to Draft Proof Your Home for RDN Residents

The Regional District of Nanaimo (RDN) has partnered with City Green Solutions and Carbon Wise to deliver a series of free, skills-focused workshops showing RDN residents how to draft proof their homes, resulting in energy savings and improving home comfort. The two-hour, in-person workshops will be led by industry experts who will show participants how to locate and fix draft issues, air-sealing techniques and how to apply weatherstripping to their doors and windows. There will also be interactive displays for participants to get hands-on experience.

- Rebates and incentives for switching to renewable energy systems, installing an electric vehicle charging station, completing a home energy assessment, irrigation upgrades, rainwater harvesting, wellhead upgrades and more. Rebates are available on a first-come, first-served basis, so be sure to check rdn.bc.ca/rdn-rebates for information on availability and how to apply.
- The Sustainable Site Planning Guide helps homeowners and builders lower the impact of construction, landscaping and major renovation projects on the natural environment.
- The Rainwater Harvesting Best Practices Guidebook provides guidance on the design, installation and maintenance of residential rainwater harvesting systems.
- Home Energy Efficiency How-to: Rebates and Renovations webpage provides step-by-step guidance on how to complete a home energy retrofit.
